We provide tutorial services to help students, particularly students who attend low performing schools in our community, English as a Second Language students, and those referred from local schools. Our students come from Cabarrus County Schools, Kannapolis City Schools, Cabarrus & Concord Charter schools, Charlotte Mecklenburg schools, and Homeschools less than 3% from nearby counties such as Rowan County. ICCD mentors provides invaluable opportunity and share their knowledge and expertise with the students who need it most. Our Programs included but not limited to:

Scope of the population ICCD serves

The International Center for Community Development (ICCD) formally known as the Hispanic Learning Center of Cabarrus (HLCCC) founded February 2001; the center targets individuals and families within Cabarrus and surrounding community that are primarily low income, under served, at-risk and the disadvantaged. We at ICCD believe in the importance of education and the power of all individuals, families, groups, agencies, and institutions to act collectively to meet the needs of their communities. Our policy is to serve all individuals regardless of race, religion, ethnic group, or economic or social status. ICCD provides extended learning and enrichment opportunities to students and parents. Monday through Thursday, for after school activities and classes, this schedule parallels the Cabarrus county school schedule. Some Family Engagement activities in the evenings or weekends. ICCD holds programs throughout the school year and in the summer.

ICCD students falls (92%) under the following classifications -: Race, Economics, and Social Status

- 1. **Hispanic:** A person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.
- 2. Black or African American: A person having origins in any of the Black racial groups of Africa.
- 3. White, not of Hispanic origin: A non-Hispanic person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, North Africa, or the Middle East.
- 4. Limited English proficient (LEP) a language other than English is used as the primary language in the home
 - **Title I students** are students participating in a program authorized under Title I of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), which is designed to improve the academic achievement of disadvantaged students and also... eligible for free or reduced-price meals under the National School Lunch and Child Nutrition Program.

We strive to equalize our kid's situation so that they have access to the same things as other students.

Snacks and Meals - A free after school snack and summer programs meals are provided for participants in accordance with USDA guidelines. During the summer we offer Breakfast and lunch plus in between me snack. ICCD staff, the board of directors, volunteers and supporters believe in the importance of education and the power of all individuals, families, groups, agencies, and institutions to act collectively to meet the needs of their communities. Education, training, and development are important aspects of a vibrant and prosperous society, providing opportunities for individuals to gain access to and succeed in lifelong learning, training and community development is a priority for our center. ICCD offers many opportunities for students to improve their academic skills while participating in fun, positive, enriching after school activities.

ICCD programs bring a wide range of benefits to youth, families, and communities. According to Irina Bokova, "Literacy is the door to knowledge, essential to individual self-esteem and empowerment." Between September 2011- Dec.2021, there were about 3700 documented children that received some sort of academic help, of the 3700, 78% were Hispanics, 81% attends Cabarrus County school. Our afterschool literacy programs help boost academic performance for our county schools, reduce rate risky behaviors, crime/juvenile delinquency, promote physical health and wellbeing, and provide a safe, structured learning/playing environment for the children of working parents. We work collaboratively with the public Library, local colleges and universities, relevant businesses, and organizations to help meet our goals and objectives to -

- increase Reading and writing skills
- encouraging family activity times
- improving oral communication, thinking skills, problem solving and decision making.
- improving and providing access to technology

Research has shown that a student's economic background is a strong predictor of his or her academic performance. 92% of ICCD students come from economically disadvantaged homes.

To help meet their needs, ICCD will work to maximizing student learning time at the center, take field tips and in-home support/resources.
